Snow Plowing – Driveways

Policy

The County will undertake custom snow plowing on private residential driveways (road to residence) for full-time / Snowbird residents.

- a) In the fall and spring, County Administration will advertise in the local paper the necessary steps for ratepayers to follow if they are desirous of custom snow plowing.
- b) The owner of the property shall sign the Hold Harmless Agreement in connection with snow plowing on private property.
- c) Scarifying of personal and commercial driveways be provided upon request, having an hourly fee charged, noting a Hold Harmless Agreement must be signed.
- d) Where and when required Grader Operators will slow down, not to damage fences in close proximity.
- e) That a 24-hour Snow Plow Driveway Service may be available at a charge of \$150.00 per visit.
- f) Full time residents out of County (boundary road) Snow Plow Driveway Service may be available at a charge of \$300.00 per year.
- g) Non – Residents of the County of Two Hills Snow Plow Driveway Service shall be available at a charge of \$400.00 per year
- h) Senior Residents of the County (boundary road) Snow Plow Driveway Service may be available at a charge of \$150.00 per year.

At the Discretion of the Public Works Supervisor:

- Driveways may be cleared by grader operators while clearing roadways.
- Having driveways cleared most effectively and efficiently as possible.
- Custom grader work (grain bins, bales, corrals etc.) will be billed separately.
- During heavy snow falls, bus routes, home care and snow plowing of roads will be given top priority.
- Driveways and parking lots for churches/graveyards and non-profit organizations to be snow plowed at no charge, but only upon request.

Purpose

To assist landowners in gaining access to their residential property.

Definition

“Snowbird” means a person whom travels to and from areas with warmer climates during the winter months, having their primary residence within County of Two Hills boundaries.

“Non-Resident” means a person who owns land in the County of Two Hills but primary residence is outside of the County of Two Hills.
